Suffered from depression on several occasions after the death of her parents and sexual abuse by her stepbrothers.

DEATH

She developed a bipolarity disorder that influenced her social life, so that she tried to commit suicide on several occasions. On March 28, 1941 Woolf committed suicide, drowning.
